Dear Friends,

St. Mary's Center continues to live our values as a community of hope, healing, and justice in this time of crisis: pandemic, recession, social upheaval. We are meeting the challenge by drawing strength and inspiration from the generosity of our volunteers, the talents of our staff, and the wisdom of the people we serve.

As 2019 began, we had high hopes for reducing hunger, as our Seniors would now receive CalFresh SNAP food support. As the year ended in June 2020, we delivered our 3,000th meal to a homebound or formerly homeless Senior.

We opened our Emergency Winter Shelter early, grateful for volunteers who readied cots on Work Day and provided home cooked meals. When the COVID-19 pandemic hit, we placed 27 unhoused Seniors in permanent and transitional housing, residential and medical care facilities, and continued providing food, health services, and connection.

Through a rigorous process, we selected SAHA Affordable Housing as a development partner for 80-100 units of new housing on two nearby parcels. We secured operating support for transitional housing programs at Friendly Manor and invested in extensive health and safety repairs.

I am particularly proud of the resilience of our supporters, volunteers, and staff, who have responded to each twist and turn, keeping the focus on our mission. Our re-organization late in the year created a dedicated Department of Interns, Volunteers and Education; aligned all case managers in a unified Clinical Team; and turned Community and Outreach Services to focus on taking services off-site.

Just as St. Mary's Center leaders have always joined forces to relieve suffering and fight injustice, we collaborated with other service providers, advocates, and people with lived experience to create the "Home Together 2020" plan to address homelessness, and persuaded Alameda County Supervisors to develop resources for real solutions.

Your continued support means more to us now than ever before. Thank you for being part of this community of hope, healing and justice as we prepare to not only bounce back, but push forward.

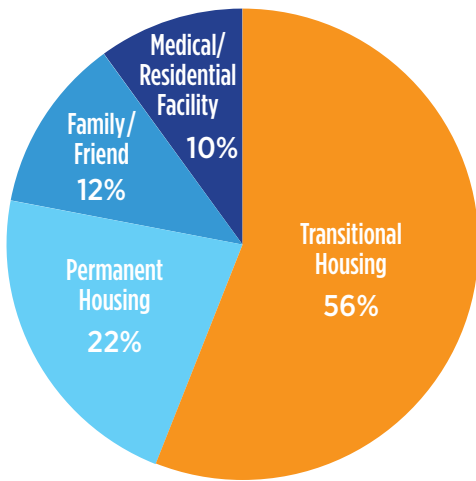

St. Mary's Center transitional housing is a critical resource in securing placements for Winter Shelter participants.

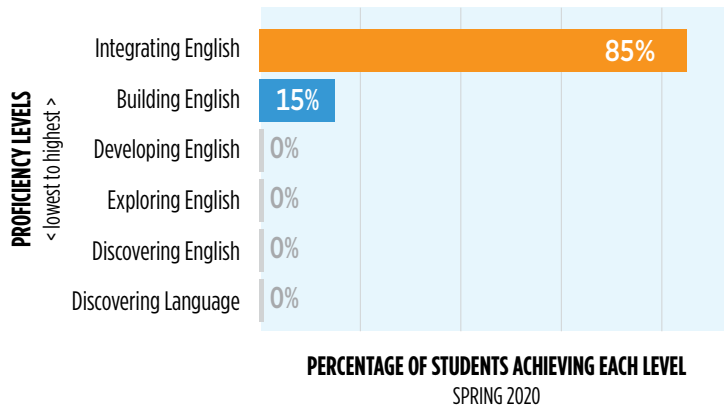
Where shelter participants exit to:

PREPARED MEALS AND GROCERY DELIVERY

When COVID-19 increased hunger, St. Mary's Center quickly pivoted from meal service onsite to delivering meals and groceries to homes.

Our network of food resources draws from volunteers, donors, Community Food Banks and USDA to provide hearty, healthy groceries for Seniors and Preschool Families.

Breaking Bread

Last year, the Food Program served over 17,845 meals to seniors and 12,000 meals to our preschoolers.

Food is an urgent need in our community. St. Mary's Center's partnerships with volunteer organizations providing hearty meals for up to 30 Seniors, 150 nights and 52 Sundays, have always helped improve nutrition, physical and mental health.

We began delivering groceries and meals in March, including daily hot meals as well as food provided by generous donors and volunteers. When Sunday Dinners had to be postponed to reduce health risks, our hardy volunteer groups switched to providing individually packaged lunches and dinners for delivery.

As CARES Act funding becomes available, St. Mary's Center developed an innovative intermediary model of partnerships to support smaller grassroots groups and deliver food with efficiency, care and compassion. ●



Breaking Barriers

St. Mary's Center completed 1,357 surveys with Seniors on COVID-19 impacts.

In collaboration with Oakford Outreach project, Computer and Technology Research Center, and Senior Fusion, a project of the American Women's Medical Association, St. Mary's Center is the lead operational partner in **WeConnect**.

This state-of-the-art program includes professional evaluation of anticipated reduction in social isolation after use of technology

to communicate with others. Donations of computers, webcams, headsets and wifi will allow Seniors to participate in community actions and maintain relationships while sheltering-in-place. The pilot program forms the basis of our transition to online programming in many areas, which will be re-assessed and deployed early in 2021. ●

Lifting Up Children and Parents

This beautiful mural endured stops and starts, just like the school year and summer session, but will be completed and enjoyed by children and parents for years to come.

St. Mary's Center supported 40 Preschool families through the school year, shutdown, and re-opening(s) by providing free technology, distance learning, and training on programs that offer curriculum materials for parents

and children. The primary challenge to remote learning is access to computers or tablets and wifi connections.

When Preschool fully re-opens, we will transition to a full-day program offering childcare from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. to better serve working parents. We will also continue to provide regular food bags for Preschool families as part of our food distribution program. ●

The spirit of giving and receiving infuses our newly-formed Department of Interns, Volunteers and Education, created to strengthen and expand partnerships. We welcomed 30 interns from Cristo Rey De La Salle, Cal State University East Bay, Holy Names University, Saint Mary's College of California, and Walden University.

Veteran and new volunteers have come forward to deliver meals and provide social connection for Seniors. Staff are working to translate holiday gift programming, volunteer recruitment and support into safe practices for Seniors and volunteers alike. ●

In total our interns contributed over 2,232 hours of meaningful service during this year.

“Almost Home” Senior Shelter

Our Emergency Winter Shelter opened two weeks early, in November 2019 – and was closed under shelter-in-place directives on the 143rd night of operation.

Our clinical case management team and shelter counselors worked around the clock to place all 27 Seniors staying in the Shelter in permanent or transitional housing, residential or

medical care, and in family reunification.

St. Mary’s Center made expedited use of our 41 units of transitional housing at three sites to quickly place unhoused Seniors in single rooms where they could shelter-in-place more safely. Generous volunteer support has provided regular Sunday dinners delivered to Seniors’ doors. ●

Transitional Housing: Closer to Home and P

Beginning in the Spring of 2020, St. Mary’s Center undertook major repairs and upgrades to Friendly Manor, the women’s drop-in center and transitional housing facility at 2298 San Pablo Avenue. Our maintenance team and contractors installed new HVAC equipment, repaired windows, replaced countertops and upgraded electrical service. A new Housing Manager brought a background in public health, and we secured an operating subsidy on 22 units from the Moving to Work program of the Oakland Housing Authority, which will improve sustainability and reduce program fees. We increased staffing levels and brought in a counselor to provide support for pandemic stress. Volunteer support through

Senior Homeless Services: Clinical Team Re-organizes

Early in the year, Senior Homeless Services focused on providing intensive case management services including help in finding and applying for affordable housing, accessing medical care including physical and mental health as well as substance abuse recovery support.

Since the shelter-in-place order, the team has been re-organized under the direction of a Licensed Clinical Social Worker, integrating all case management services for housed and unhoused Seniors to improve practice. Critical support is offered both onsite in the garden at St. Mary's Center and via tele-health calls.

Moving forward, the Clinical team is looking at ways to sustain the current client intensive case management caseload, while also planning expanded services to unhoused Seniors during



the winter months. As congregant sheltering is not advised during COVID-19, we will collaborate with community based medical teams at homeless encampments. Our goal is to continue to offer vulnerable homeless Seniors a path to housing and wellness. ●

Showing Up and Speaking Out

For almost 20 years St. Mary's Center Advocates for Hope and Justice has prepared Seniors to advocate for policy changes that directly impact their lives.

Senior Advocates for Hope and Justice regularly works with partner agencies to provide insight into issues, invite experts to meet with the community, and sit on local commissions and boards. This year, California's Governor appointed Janny Castillo, Director of Community Outreach and Services, to the Master Plan on Aging Stakeholder Advisory Committee.

Despite the pandemic, Hope and Justice delivered accomplishments this year including:

- Maintaining SSI grants for extremely low income and disabled persons
- Advocating for a county measure to provide homelessness services
- Promoting the Census to "hard-to-count" populations
- Initiating a countywide dialogue between service providers, legislators, and local government staff on re-opening senior centers post COVID-19

The transition to remote work has not deterred Seniors for Hope and Justice. They continue to play leadership roles at:

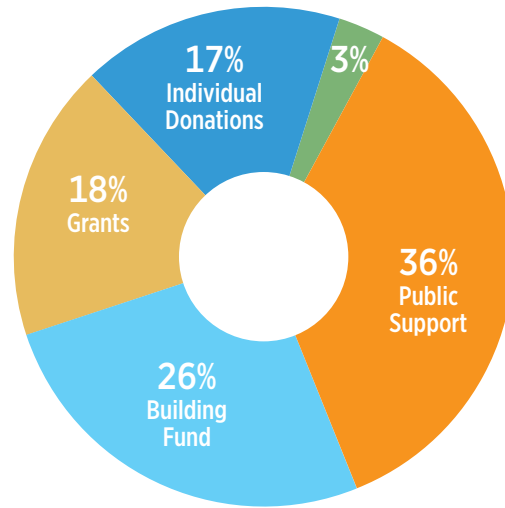

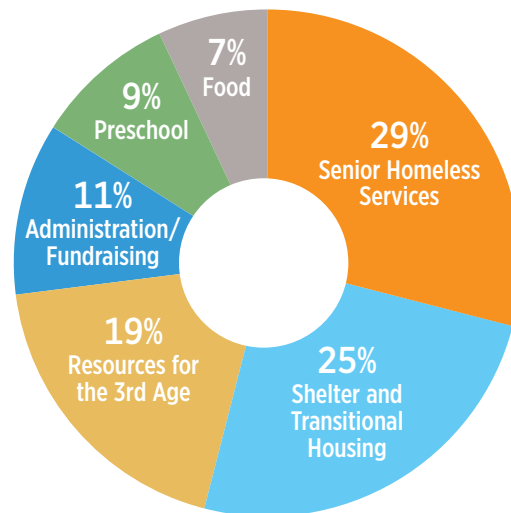
